
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Application Cut-off Date for Agricultural Conservation Easement Program Extended to July 18, 2018

ELLENSBURG, Wash. (May 18, 2018) – The Kittitas County Conservation District announces an extension of the application deadline to **July 18, 2018** to sign-up for the Agricultural Conservation Easement Program (ACEP) through the “Yakima Integrated Plan- Toppenish To Teanaway” project. This sign-up is specific to Kittitas County and is funded through the USDA’s [Regional Conservation Partnership Program](#).

Funding for ACEP is provided through the USDA Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS). NRCS provides funds to conservation partners (e.g. state or local agencies, non-profits) to purchase conservation easements on private working lands. This program helps keep working lands working, especially in areas experiencing development pressure.

Landowners continue to own their property but voluntarily enter into a legal agreement with a cooperating conservation partner to purchase an easement. The cooperating entity applies for matching funds from NRCS for the purchase of an easement from the landowner, permanently protecting its agricultural use and conservation values. Landowners do not apply directly to NRCS for funding under this program.
