#### A. NRCS Programs

### VI. Action Items

#### A. Heritage Gardens Program

1. City of Ellensburg MOA – The Heritage Gardens Program is picking up momentum in the City of Ellensburg. Since Ellensburg is not in the District boundaries, an MOU is needed to work with landowners there. This is common practice by other conservation districts administering the program. Since it is funded by Department of Ecology for the Yakima Basin Integrated Plan's Municipal subcommittee, working in the city is acceptable for their program.

## B. NRI – Chipping Crew

- 1. City of Roslyn Interlocal Agreement for Upper Kittitas County Fuels Crew Anna reported that pending a meeting of their Fire Commissioners last evening, Kittitas County Fire District No. 7 has agreed to work with the Upper Kittitas County Fuels crew facilitated by the City of Roslyn for chipping work this year. KCCD has an agreement in place with the City of Roslyn that needs an amendment to include this work in it.

## C. FY24 Community Project Funding Request - Representative Kim Schrier

## 1. Application for Biochar Equipment

Anna reported that Representative Schrier is currently soliciting for community projects in her district. The projects are geared towards the most significant needs within the communities of Members of Congress. Each Member of Congress will be allowed to submit 15 qualified local projects. The deadline for applications is March 13<sup>th</sup> at 11 pm PST.

Lynn Brewer with Swiftwater LLC has been working on a potential Biochar opportunity in Kittitas County involving the purchase of biochar modules from Qualterra, a company based out of Pullman. She drafted the proposal provided in the agenda and is asking for the District's support as the applicant for Representative Schrier's solicitation. The District's commitment would be to utilize funding to purchase biochar units.

#### D. 2023 PAM Cost Share

The 2023 PAM Cost Share Program begins this month. Landowner cost share agreements must be signed by the landowner and by the District prior to purchase of materials. The cost share is 50% with a \$1,000 hold down for PAM and 50% with a \$150 hold down for a PAM applicator.

#### E. YTAHP

#### 1. Anderson Perry Task Order Amendments -

Two task orders with Anderson Perry & Associates need amendments. Both amendments add final design, bidding and construction assistance as well as extending them to July

2024. The amendment for the Coleman Creek RM 4.5 Schomer/Beard Fish Passage Improvements adds \$59,365 for all additional requested work bringing the total task order to \$95,890. The amendment for the Naneum Creek RM 2.9 and RM 3.6 Fish Passage Improvements adds \$63,305 for all additional requested work bringing the total task order to \$106,560.

# G. Washington Shrubsteppe Restoration & Resiliency Initiative

## 1. Application for Vantage Hwy Fire Landowner

Anna reported that a landowner in the Vantage Highway Fire is seeking fire recovery assistance. They contacted the District immediately after the fire looking for help with reseeding, fencing and erosion control. The Conservation Commission has funding available through the Washington Shrubsteppe Restoration & Resiliency Initiative and will provide 100% cost share to replace burned fence with wildlife friendly fencing. Applications need to be submitted ASAP as the work must be complete by June 30. The District's role is only with fencing and there is approximately 1.5 miles to replace and more to be removed.

<u>MOTION-</u> Authorize the District Manager to submit an application to the Conservation Commission for landowner assistance and approve landowner agreement consistent with any Commission funding approved.
