

# Drought Resiliency Funding

**Applications Due December 19, 2025**



The Kittitas County Conservation District (KCCD) is offering cost share beginning immediately for projects that improve irrigation efficiencies and drought resiliency for Kittitas County farmers and ranchers. Funding will be provided through cost share agreements directly to producers.

## **Irrigation Water Management**

Soil moisture Monitoring Equipment/Services

**50% reimbursement up to \$5,000/producer**

## **Irrigation Infrastructure Improvements**

Re-nozzling, gasket replacements, pump upgrades or other actions to conserve irrigation water

**75% reimbursement up to \$5,000/producer**

In addition to specific activities named above, KCCD will consider other activities that meet the goals of water use efficiency.

Applications will be ranked and approved as allowed by the available funding. Project designs must meet practice specifications. There is no reimbursement for already purchased materials, equipment or services. Approved work must be completed by May 31, 2026.
